

BOROUGH OF ATGLEN

ORDINANCE NO. 226

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the Borough Council of the Borough of Atglen, as follows:

This Ordinance shall be known and cited as the "Snow, Hail, Sleet, or Ice Removal Ordinance of the Borough of Atglen."

It shall be the duty of every person, using or occupying in any manner, or for any purpose whatever, any house, shop or business of any kind, and of persons having charge of churches and public buildings of every description within the limits of the Borough of Atglen, and owners of unoccupied houses and vacant lots situated on any street, alley or highway in the Borough of Atglen, having pavement or footways to remove, or cause to be removed from the pavement or footways in front of their premises, any snow, hail, sleet or ice within two (2) working hours after the same has ceased to fall or be formed thereon, provided that if the two (2) hours herein allowed shall not have expired at six (6) o'clock P.M., it shall be the duty of the person or persons abovesaid to remove the snow, hail, sleet or ice as abovesaid, before ten (10) o'clock A.M., on the succeeding day.

Any person who violates any of the provisions hereof shall be liable to a fine or penalty not less than Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) or not more than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00), which fines or penalties shall be collected as like fines or penalties are collected by law.

The provisions of this Ordinance shall be severable, and if any of the provisions shall be held to be unconstitutional or void, such decision shall not affect the validity of any of the remaining provisions of the Ordinance. It is hereby declared as the intent of the Borough Council that this Ordinance would have been adopted had such unconstitutional or void provision not been included therein.
