Leaf Collection

Weather permitting, leaf collection will take place weekly, every Monday, beginning on Monday, October 21 and ending in early December. Rake your leaves into a pile along the edge of the roadway/edge of your property. In order to not damage our equipment the leaf piles must be free of branches, grass clippings, and miscellaneous debris.

Our leaf collection equipment is 12 feet high. If you have tree limbs that overhang the road and are lower than 12 feet in height trim the limbs to prevent potential damage to your tree and our equipment.



Flushing Public Water Lines Tuesday, October 15 (Rain Date – Thursday, October 17)

One component of our public water maintenance program is flushing the water distribution pipes. We do this by opening some of the fire hydrants and letting the water flow. Sometimes this creates a change in the appearance of your household drinking water. The water may appear discolored or cloudy. The water has been treated and is safe to drink, cook, and bathe. Before you wash your clothes confirm the water is running clear. If you ran the washing machine and the laundry appears discolored do not use bleach. Bleach will set the rust stain in the clothing. Landlords, please share this information with your tenants.

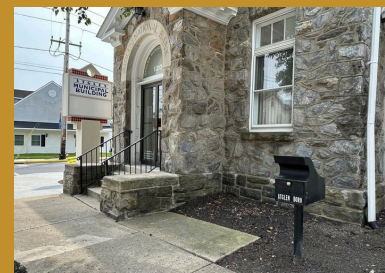


Halloween - Trick or Treat
